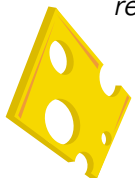

Julie is responsible for overall planning and coordination of bioterrorism surveillance and response activities in the agency. She coordinates the activities of the Bioterrorism Team, provides guidance and leadership to other state agencies on bioterrorism preparedness, as well as establishes policies and procedures related to investigation of bioterrorism. She reports to public health professionals across the state and assesses each agency's (local and state) ability to detect, communicate and respond to a bioterrorism/communicable disease event as well as develops plans to enhance existing or develop new surveillance systems.
