Brett Finlay, Professor, Michael Smith Laboratories, & Departments of Biochemistry & Molecular Biology, & Microbiology & Immunology, UBC will speak on: "E. coli 0157: How does it work and what can we do?". His major research interest is host-pathogen interactions, at the molecular level. By combining cell biology with microbiology, he has been at the forefront making several fundamental discoveries in this field, and publishing over 250 papers. His laboratory studies several pathogenic bacteria, with Salmonella and pathogenic E. coli interactions with host cells being the primary focus. Dr. Finlay is an excellent and entertaining speaker who is a strong supporter of communicating science to the public.

8:15 Dr. Brian Radke, Public Health Veterinarian, BC Centre of Disease Control will speak on "Bacterial Surveillance of Retail Meat - Results From CIPARS". Dr. Radke has been involved in the Canadian Integrated Program for Antimicrobial Resistance Surveillance

(CIPARS). CIPARS collects antimicrobial resistance information in enteric pathogens and commensal organisms from the agri-food sector (farm level, abattoir level and retail level), in enteric pathogens isolated from humans, and on antimicrobial use in humans and animals. The programs approach is part of a representative, methodologically unified approach, modeled after international initiatives such as the National Antimicrobial Resistance Monitoring System (NARMS-USA) and the Danish Integrated Antimicrobial Resistance Monitoring and Research Programme (DANMAP-Denmark).
